### How to Help A Child Who's Lost A Parent To Suicide ...

If you think your teen is in immediate danger, call 911, your local emergency number or a suicide hotline number — such as the National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 800-273-TALK (800-273-8255) in the United States. If you suspect that your teen might be thinking about suicide, talk to him or her immediately.

The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline at 1-800-273-8255 and suicidepreventionlifeline.org provides free and confidential emotional support from a trained counselor and is available 24-hours a day/7-days a week. ### Surviving Your Child's Suicide - Compassionate Friends

When a child is discharged from the hospital or psychiatric hospital after a suicide attempt, their medical team will provide a care plan. Parents and mental health providers can also help children develop a safety plan—a go-to resource for when they feel stressed, need additional support, or are in crisis mode.

For anyone to lose a parent is hell, but to know that they did it by their own hands and because they were so unhappy is almost unbearable. They say suicide usually leaves 6 "survivors", in my case it was 4 immediate family members: my sister, my mum, my dad's brother - our uncle - and me.
