Remove and replace the old brake hardware clip(s) with new ones. Use copper anti-seize lubricant on the surfaces where the new brake pads come in contact with the caliper bracket. Also, apply anti-seize to the new clips and to the back sides of the brake pads. SAFETY NOTE. Do not allow anti-seize to contaminate the surface of the brake pads!

Check the brake rotor for the presence of a ridge on the outer edge; if present, remove the ridge or replace the brake rotor and brake pads. Check for debris in the brake lining material, clean and reinstall. Check the brake linings for wear and replace the brake linings if wear is approaching the lining wear limit.

Spray the inside of the caliper thoroughly with brake cleaner to remove all the built-up brake dust, road dirt and old grease from the caliper slide pins. Wipe the pins with the rag to remove any remaining dust, dirt or old lube. Step 5 Lubricate the caliper slide pins with the white lithium grease.
