Vygotsky scaffolding is part of the education concept "zone of

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proximal development" or ZPD. The ZPD is the set of skills or knowledge a student can't do on her own but can do with the help or guidance of someone else. It's the skill level just above where the student currently is. According to Vygotsky
(1978), much
important learning by

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interaction with a skillful tutor. The tutor may model behaviors and/or provide verbal instructions for the child. Vygotsky refers to this as cooperative or collaborative dialogue.

Scaffolding is helpful because it helps young children who are new to a school

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environment build confidence while learning.
